<u>Program</u>: Rep. Dan Hawkins, Speaker of the Kansas House Rep. Hawkins has served in the House for 10 years: 4 years as Republican Majority Leader. Both he and the President of the Senate visited with Republican members to identify their issues. Those issues were grouped into 8 buckets and include over 200 bill proposals. He also led the Republican caucus to have a biennial plan and regular progress reports to the caucus.

Some of the priority issues for the Republican caucus are:

- 1.Education: fairness in women's sports & funding 100% of special ed costs for each school district
- 2.Protecting the safety net, i.e. first responders as an example
- 3. Workforce development due to shortage of employees
- 4. Water conservation, possibly use portion of state sales tax to fund the water plan
- 5.Use \$600 million of the \$2.5 billion revenue surplus; exempt WISC allowed purchases; flat tax for lower income residents; no state tax on Social Security because retirees are moving to Texas & Florida with lower taxes.
