She thanked the club for providing productive activities for youth.

The \$7.9 million Youth Crisis & Recovery building is located near other FSG services at SW 6<sup>th</sup> & Frazier.
Construction will be completed next Fall on a two-story building which will have 24 beds: 16 for crisis intervention & 8 for substance abuse. The Center will add 28-day maximum treatment. In Kansas, there are 10 beds for substance abuse. Before Covid-19, the number of youths served was increasing and the severity of mental health and substance abuse increased more during Covid.
