Why farm and ranch estate planning? 65% of all farmers are over age 55 and many will retire by 2030. To avoid mistakes and to minimize estate taxes, define your goals and find a competent attorney. Common excuses are: Fairness to avoid angry heirs is subjective and objective business decision is important; I'll do it someday and never gets done; Too expensive because cost ranges from \$2,000 to \$10,000; and let the kids figure it out which ends up being a mess and judge decides estate distribution.
