Sen. O'Shea has completed the first three years of her 4 year term. Redistricting changed her district but it remained mostly rural and includes north Topeka. She served on the **Education, Commerce and Public** Health and Welfare committees. During the interim months, the Senate and House combine committees. She serves on the Corrections, Juvenile Justice and Child Welfare committees. The last session dealt with a \$4 billion budget surplus. The Governor vetoed tax reduction bills. More money was allocated for Crisis Pregnancy Centers. Other topics discussed were Medicaid eligibility changes during Covid, vaccinations, lack of child care, fentanyl, state water plan, Women's Bill of Rights, school choice, education funding, Legislative Post Audit, Medicaid expansion. She offered a "Day with the Senator" during the legislative session
