North Topeka News: David Jackson reported the Meier's property for sale on Lower Silver Lake Road has 3 wells which increases the value. The bridges on US 24, west of Meriden Road, over the Soldier Creek, need replacement of railings and buried cables on both sides of US 24 will come together and be buried under the creek. Raising the dikes 1.5' on Soldier Creek, west of Menoken Road, are delayed after finding Indian artifacts. Project is \$390,000 with half paid by North Topeka Drainage district.

His trip to Antarctica was cancelled due to 65' wave which damaged the ship and made national news. The Galapagos Islands are 600 miles east of Ecuador. Although the islands are on the equator and provide 12 hours of daylight every day, and steady temperatures, the ocean water is very cold due to currents. The 127 islands vary in size, there's no fresh water, no trees and active volcanoes. Only 3,300 people live there. In the 1800s, pirates used the islands as a base and nearly killed all the tortoises for food. The pirates also brought rats. In the 1900s, elimination of the rats was a major effort because the animals have no fear. There's no natural predator. On the 7 or 8 main islands, 97% of the land is a national park. To visit the islands, a guide is required for a group no larger than 8 to 10 people, who must use the paths for a 2 hour tour.
