Optimist Board meeting, 5:45 pm, February 13th

<u>Program</u>: Rep Dan Hawkins, Speaker of the Kansas House of Representatives

For the 2023 Legislative session, a listening tour developed a Better Way plan with eight topics rather than a reactive approach to legislative action.

Overriding the Governor's veto of the flat tax bill will likely not happen. The Governor's 2025 proposed budget spends half the \$3 billion ending balance and



is a 13.8% budget increase. We have \$1.7 billion in the rainy day fund.

Preventing cyberattacks by Russians and Chinese is a priority. All three branches of government are working together. The attacks on the state's court system and K-State are recent examples. The Chief Justice didn't pay the \$1 million ransom. Automated Intelligence (AI) will likely be used to address cyberattacks.

There are four bills addressing cybersecurity, e.g. not investing KPERs in China or other adversaries and checking whether Chinese ownership in companies receiving tax incentives to build in Kansas.

Water conservation will be addressed as lakes are becoming silted in and rivers are drying up in some communities, e.g. Caney in southeast Kansas is building a 12-mile pipeline for water in Coffeyville.

Legislative work will likely end April 30 as all legislative positions are on the November, 2024 ballot. Legislators will want to start campaigning.
