damaged) store moved into 3 buildings north of Rose Muffler. This business location was originally a used car lot. When Dave and Jack DeBacker were on school board, USD 345 was looking to build an administration building.

**<u>Program</u>: Chad Lady, Soldier Township Fire Chief.** 

The original fire station in 1937 was a Quonset hut garage in the alley south of the original Seaman High School. A siren was the initial fire call. In addition to the 8 volunteer fire fighters, the fire truck would stop at the high school and the principal decided which students were allowed to assist. Now, phone calls, pagers and cell phone apps are used.

This township is the largest township in Kansas, 63 square miles with 15,000 residents. Seven full time staff are assisted by 30 volunteers. Four area townships support Soldier with fire calls. A new fire station to replace or remodel the current station built in 1976 will provide space for larger fire trucks and additional staff to cover the platted 1,000 new houses. Staff could be added to the station located at 82<sup>nd</sup> & Topeka.

Chad is a Seaman alumnus and has worked at the township for 18 years.
