Rich has worked in retail farm and home supply products for 45 years. He loved working retail, felt it was a privilege and an honor and believed in supporting local business. Several employees were Seaman graduates. Faith guided his work and family. Each business expansion began with prayer. He retired in December 2023 and his son and daughter now own the business.

His parents moved to Hoyt in 1972 and he graduated from Royal Vally in 1982. His dad bought the small gas station in 1978 at the current location of Tarwater's. Rich started out pumping gas, airing up tires, and washing car windows at age 14. His first customer chewed him out as was deserved.

When his dad retired in 1997, he got a loan from Silver Lake bank without collateral. Tarwater's also has a grain elevator in North Topeka which holds products purchased from area farmers who purchased seed from Tarwater's. By 2013, expansions included several buildings and a large parking lot covering the original gas station site. In 2019, Tarwater's purchased Holton Farm and Home.
