July 25, 39th Annual Optimist Golf tournament

Program: State Rep. Kyle McNorton Legislative leaders changed the length of the session from 90 working days to 90 calendar days or 2 weeks less time. An interim committee developed a FY 2026 budget ahead of the governor's budget. Legislative budget includes pay raises for state employees based on each employee's pay amount in comparison to market rate pay, not across the board percentage pay increase. Mostly federal money has resulted in 40% state budget increase over 10 years. The House approved budget includes only \$200 million of the \$1.1 billion requested by state agencies. Education funding totals \$11.1 billion and \$200 million increase for special ed. He explained costs of Medicaid expansion and potential constitutional amendments.

Hello, fellow Optimists,

As you know, in January, California experienced devastating wildfires *with a loss of over 7,000 homes and businesses.* Ruth Nelson of the Olathe Noon Club reached out to Optimist leaders in California and learned that ten Optimist club member families lost their homes in the Palisades Park wildfire. Their homes were completely destroyed with nothing left to salvage. Chuck Sawyer, Governor of the Pacific Southwest District, said the district is asking for donations to provide direct help to the affected families.

During this week's meeting of the Kansas District Executive Committee, the group agreed to invite our Kansas Optimists, on a personal or club basis, to help these families. The Optimist International Foundation will undoubtedly provide some aid to California members, but that will be in the form of rebuilding infrastructure. We would like to collect funds to assist the Optimists affected by the fire with personal needs such as meals, clothing, and other critical emergency needs. This is a way Kansas Optimists can send a message of support and care for those who have been affected by the fires as they begin to rebuild their lives.

As indicated, donations can be made either as individuals or as clubs. Donations can be made the following ways:

1) Sending a check to Kansas District Treasurer, Joe Shank, 6119 Noland Rd., Shawnee, KS 66216. Forms are attached to this email to complete, print, and send with your check. All checks should be made payable to Kansas District Optimists, and "California Wildfire Support" put on the memo line.

2) Going to the Optimist website at <u>https://www.ksoptimist.org</u>. There you can click the "Donate" button which will take you to a fillable form to complete and make a credit card donation. There are also forms available on our website to fill in, print, and send with your check to Joe Shank as indicated above.

3) Making a credit card donation on your phone by using the QR code below which will open a fillable form for you to complete and use to donate.

Once all donations are collected, a check from the Kansas District will be sent to Bill Hadala, Pacific Southwest Treasurer, for distribution directly to the affected families. *Please note that these donations are not tax deductible*. If you wish to make a tax-deductible donation, you should do so to organizations such as The American Red Cross or World Central Kitchen.
